

***NOTICE OF DATA SECURITY EVENT***

Universal Pure, LLC (“Universal Pure”) is providing notice of a data security event that may affect the security of information related to certain individuals. Universal Pure is notifying individuals, which includes information about the event, Universal Pure’s response, and steps potentially impacted individuals may take. The confidentiality, privacy, and security of information is one of Universal Pure’s highest priorities and Universal Pure takes this matter very seriously.

On August 20, 2024, Universal Pure identified suspicious activity related to certain systems which resulted in a network outage. In response, Universal Pure immediately took steps to secure its environment, launched an investigation to determine the nature and scope of the activity, and notified law enforcement. The investigation determined there was unauthorized access and that certain files were taken from the Universal Pure network between July 10, 2024 and August 20, 2024. As a result, Universal Pure began an extensive review of the involved files and folders to determine whether sensitive information may be impacted. Although the information varied by individual, the information includes name, driver’s license number, financial account information, Social Security number, medical information, health insurance information, passport number, and/or taxpayer identification number.

Universal Pure provided individuals with notice of this event whose information was involved and which Universal Pure had address information to send them a letter. Although Universal Pure is not aware of any identity theft or fraud as a result of this incident, Universal Pure is providing individuals with complimentary credit monitoring services and notified state regulators. Universal Pure also reviewed existing security policies and implemented additional measures to further protect against similar incidents moving forward.

Universal Pure encourages potentially impacted individuals to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud, to review account statements, and to monitor their credit reports for suspicious activity and to detect errors. Under U.S. law, a consumer is entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus, Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion. Consumers may also contact the three major credit reporting bureaus directly listed below to request a free copy of their credit report.

Consumers have the right to place an initial or extended “fraud alert” on a credit file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a 1-year alert that is placed on a consumer’s credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert display on a consumer’s credit file, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer’s identity before extending new credit. If consumers are the victim of identity theft, they are entitled to an extended fraud alert, which is a fraud alert lasting seven years. Should consumers wish to place a fraud alert, please contact any of the three major credit reporting bureaus listed below.

As an alternative to a fraud alert, consumers have the right to place a “credit freeze” on a credit report, which will prohibit a credit bureau from releasing information in the credit report without the consumer’s express authorization. The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in a consumer’s name without consent. However, consumers should be aware that using a credit

freeze to take control over who gets access to the personal and financial information in their credit report may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application they make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, consumers cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on their credit report. To request a credit freeze, individuals may need to provide some or all of the following information:

1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., II, III, etc.);
2. Social Security number;
3. Date of birth;
4. Addresses for the prior two to five years;
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility bill or telephone bill;
6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (state driver's license or ID card, etc.); and
7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft if they are a victim of identity theft.

Consumers have the right to file a police report if they ever experience identity theft or fraud. Please note that in order to file a report with law enforcement for identity theft, consumers will likely need to provide some proof that they have been a victim. Instances of known or suspected identity theft should also be reported to law enforcement and the relevant state Attorney General. This notice has not been delayed by law enforcement.
